

A curriculum to support your needs

However, there is the possibility for students to take four. These subjects are chosen from the wide range on offer, the details of which are set out in the course information booklet. Some of the subjects on offer will be familiar from GCSE and some, psychology and sociology for example, will be new. Additionally, all Year 12 students follow an enrichment programme to develop additional skills and opportunities for learning. At the end of Year 12, students take an internal assessment. Students must have gained a D grade or higher in these, in order to continue the course into Year 13.

The Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) is run by Greenshaw as a way of preparing students for the rigours of independent study at university - it is highly valued by many universities. The EPQ will help develop key skills such as resilience, time management, research, responsiveness, adaptability, written and verbal communication skills, and fundamental thinking skills. Most importantly, the project is an opportunity to demonstrate a love of learning. Students will be selected on the basis of academic performance and their skills in self management towards the end of their Year 12 studies. Students wishing to take an EPQ may have to put forward their ideas to be selected.

Preparing you for the future

Following their time at Greenshaw, students take a variety of paths. The majority continue their education at university, some choose to enter their chosen profession whilst others opt for a gap year, either to broaden their experience of the world or to take a little more time to decide upon the direction they wish to take.

The school supports students in this decision-making process in a number of ways. For those who choose university, we make prospectuses available, organise day trips, invite representatives of universities to speak and offer personal advice about possible choices. Once choices have been made, we offer a comprehensive support programme for the completion of the UCAS process. Following the receipt of final A level results, we continue to offer support to students in finalising the places they have chosen.

For students who decide that university is not for them, we offer the same level of support and guidance. Careers interviews are arranged and support given in the application process. Where possible, we will help to organise work experience placements and do all that we can to help students place themselves in their chosen career.

Courses

The majority of our students follow a course comprising of three A level subjects. However, there is the possibility for students to take four. Students will choose subjects from the list of subjects.

The grade requirement for entry into sixth form will be a minimum of five grade B, or grade 6, full GCSEs, to include at least a grade C, or grade 5, in both mathematics and English language. Subjects may specify that you need a particular grade before you can take up the course, eg mathematics requires a grade B, or grade 6, in mathematics.

> Students must have gained a D grade, or higher, in internal end of Year 12 exams, in order to continue the course into Year 13.

Opportunities for enrichment

Our curriculum is enriched by activities that make Greenshaw a dynamic and exciting place to learn. There is an extensive programme of educational visits offered to students that includes field trips for geography and science. Trips to museums, art galleries and the theatre enhance students' learning. Visiting experts such as lawyers, scientists and journalists bring their knowledge of careers and employment into the classroom. There is a group of students working towards the popular Silver Duke of Edinburgh award.

The school has an expedition programme. Teams of students work together to plan and fund-raise for challenges on other continents. Recent expeditions to Honduras, Ecuador, Morocco, Borneo, Peru, Tanzania and Nepal have given students opportunities to meet people across the globe and understand the issues facing them.

The PE department has recently launched a sixth form games afternoon, where a diverse range of sporting activities are on offer. All sixth formers are encouraged to take part in physical recreation as an outlet to their academic studies, but other activities such as charity work are available as an option.
