# An update on Year 10...





I would like to start by congratulating our male sports teams in Year 10. The basketball team worked hard to win the under 15 Surrey Schools Eastern Division and progress to the semi-finals. The team also recently won their Surrey County Cup semi-final, meaning they will join the under 16 team at Surrey Sports Park in March for the finals. Meanwhile, our footballers have also enjoyed success following a very competitive football match where they saw off St Joseph's College 3-1 to put them in the last eight of the Surrey Cup. It was a tremendous effort from both our teams.

Moving on to child development, where students have been completing their last piece of coursework this academic year. Mrs Leppard and Mrs Ernstzen have been very impressed at the standard of the work submitted, along with students' ability to meet tight deadlines. Students have now started to work on the last two components for their summer exam and will also be revising hard for their assessment on March 6th.

Our Year 10 geographers have completed their huge unit on the coastal landscape, having most recently analysed the advantages and disadvantages of different methods of engineering to protect coastlines from erosion. This analysis culminated in looking closely at the fastest eroding coastline in Europe – the Holderness coastline in north east England, where in some cases the land is retreating at 10 metres per year. The next topic they will be studying is river landscapes, where students will study how a river changes from its start (source) to its end (mouth) at the sea.

Congratulations to those Year 10 students who performed with The Company at *The Great Big Dance Off* on 31st January, at Beck Theatre, Hayes. It was an exciting opportunity to see other schools' performances and for students to perform on a professional stage. All students from Year 10 enrolled on our dance course will have a summative theory assessment on 6th February, a choreography assessment at the end of the spring term and their examination dance evening on 21st March, with further details to follow.

In maths, students will need to utilise the work in their exercise books for the individual skills and processes involved in order to prepare for their upcoming assessments. Those sitting the foundation paper will be tested on their knowledge of right-angle triangles, probability and multiplicative reasoning, whilst our higher paper pupils will need to know similarity and



congruence, more trigonometry and further statistics. The maths department would also like to recognise the following nineteen students who are independently working hard using the online platform *HegartyMaths* in order to review and consolidate their skills in maths. # WOULD YOU CONSIDER BECOMING A PARENT GOVERNOR?

We currently have a vacancy for a parent governor on the Greenshaw High School governing body.

There is provision for two parent governors on the governing body, to work alongside other governors representing school staff, as well as governors appointed by the Greenshaw Learning Trust Board of Trustees and by the governing body itself. There is currently a total of ten governors.

The role of the school governor is both rewarding to the individual and invaluable to the school. You will need to be supportive of the values of the school and be able to give time and effort to further its ongoing development; support and training is provided.

No specific experience is required; however, the governing body would particularly welcome applications from parents with previous governor experience, or with experience in either education, other public sector settings, finance or business sectors.



As a governor you will be expected to attend meetings and take an active part in them, help the governing body make informed decisions, and get involved with the school and its pupils. The governing body normally meets six times a year, in the evening. You will also be asked to take on particular tasks in relation to the work of the governing body, such as being a lead governor for a specific area of school development, or to be part of ad-hoc sub committees of the governing body.

There are rules on a person's eligibility to be a governor, e.g. relating to bankruptcy and criminal convictions, and requirements on disclosure of interests and involvement in other bodies that could impact on the work of the Greenshaw Learning Trust or the school.

Parents wishing to stand for election are asked to complete the application form from the school website. Application forms must be returned to the school, marked for the attention of the Head of Clerking, Greenshaw Learning Trust, by the closing date of **Monday 4th February at 9.00 am**.

If more than one application is received, a ballot will be held in which all parents and carers may vote; in these circumstances the applicants' personal statements will be made available to all parents/carers to inform their vote.
