Dear parents and carers of Year 12 students,

I do hope you are all keeping well at this time and are continuing to stay safe and well as we now navigate our way through this next phase. Further to my letter on 5th June, I am pleased to say that we are now in a position to provide a face to face provision for all Year 12 students starting from Monday 29th June.

I must stress however that we are required to adhere to NHS and DfE guidance. This will mean a limited number of students will be invited onto the school site but we also have other ways of connecting better with our students. Below is an outline of what the next phase of term will look like and the support proposed for our year 12 students

In school mentoring

A small group of students who have experienced particular difficulty with home learning will be invited in to attend academic mentoring sessions on a one-week basis from Monday to Thursday. The emphasis here will be on motivation and engagement, alongside any subject learning.

'Creative' subjects

Students who are studying subjects like art, graphics, photography, fashion or media studies will be invited onto site at set times and days to access the necessary equipment they require to complete their projects. Where a student studies more than one 'creative' subject, we have taken this into consideration and will support them with additional time in school over the coming weeks.

Any students who are expected in school from next week will receive individual letters with further details about timings and expectations on site.

Subject based teaching sessions

There will be online 'face to face' lessons for all Year 12 students in the week commencing 29th June, until the end of term. These will be delivered by your child's subject teachers and will be open to all students within their subjects. There will be an individual timetable for each student and strict online protocol which all students will be expected to follow. I will write out to you with more information on these in the coming days.

Reconsidering end of year exams

Year 12 would normally sit end of year exams in June of the academic year however this will not be possible this year. I have considered whether students should be set this by departments in the same manner to Friday assessments however, I do not feel that this would be a true reflection of their work and knowledge, especially after a considerable time of home learning. I feel that it is important that students do not miss out on the opportunity to assess their learning in preparation for final exams next year and have decided that these will be best sat on our return to school early in the autumn term.

We are navigating an ever changing situation and I very much appreciate your support.
