Year 10 pupils: the next steps

This week we have had the pleasure of welcoming back on site many of our Year 10 pupils. It has been brilliant to see pupils returning and I hope that the psychological gains for pupils re-entering the site and coming in to classrooms will play a positive role in their reintegration over the coming weeks.

At this time of the summer term, in any other year, we would be celebrating the end of GCSE and A Level exams and beginning to focus on the upcoming year for our Year 10 and 12 students. In any other year we would be inviting Year 10 families in to the school to listen to messages about the twelve months ahead and understand how best we can all support your child through a critical year of their education.

Just this morning I was talking with pupils in Year 10 who were returning to school. They were asking me questions about what their exams this time next year might look like. While I could not give false reassurance to the pupils about things that have yet to be decided I <u>do</u> have confidence that the national system will adapt, and that this group of pupils will not be allowed to be disadvantaged.

So we will still be running our information evening and I would like to take this opportunity to invite you to our 'Road to Success' evening. The presentation will set out to explain the key marker points for your child in Year 11, their possible post-16 pathways and how we can work together to best support them during the year ahead.

We will be holding this on **Thursday 9th of July at 4:30pm** and we hope that between today and that date that there may be more information about the arrangements for the 2021 summer exams.

His purpose is to ensure that students make excellent progress across our curriculum and work with individuals and families to ensure that barriers to progress are removed.
