The majority of our students follow a course comprising of three A Level subjects, although each year some high achieving students study four A Levels, typically including maths and further maths. This, alongside the Extended Project Qualification (see below), is the optimal course structure for admission to Russell Group universities.

The Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) is run by Greenshaw Sixth Form as a way of preparing students for the rigours of independent study at university – it is highly valued by many universities.

The EPQ will help develop key skills such as resilience, time management, research, responsiveness, adaptability, written and verbal communication skills, and fundamental thinking skills. Most importantly, the project is an opportunity to demonstrate a love of learning. Students will be selected on the basis of academic performance and their skills in self management towards the end of their Year 12 studies. Students wishing to take an EPQ may have to put forward their ideas to be selected and meet minimum internal requirements to complete the qualification.

SUPPORTIVE ENVIRONMENT

At Greenshaw we pride ourselves on the quality of support and guidance that we offer.

We have an experienced and effective Sixth Form leadership who are reinforced in their work by a team of tutors, administrative and learning support staff. The aim of this team is to ensure that students are well supported throughout their time at Greenshaw Sixth Form, given advice and guidance where it is needed and provided with all the information they need to make informed decisions about their future.

This supportive environment also extends to individual subjects. THE FUTURE

Following their time at Greenshaw, students take a variety of paths. The majority continue their education at university, some choose art foundation courses, others choose to enter their chosen profession or an apprenticeship, whilst others opt for a gap year, either to broaden their experience of the world or to take a little more time to decide upon the direction they wish to take.

The school supports students in this decision-making process in a number of ways. For those who choose university or art foundation courses, we make prospectuses available, inform of open days and other opportunities, invite representatives of universities/colleges to speak and offer personal advice about possible choices. Once choices have been made, we offer a comprehensive support programme for the completion of UCAS or the college application process this includes advice and guidance on personal statements, portfolio assessment/support and interview practice. Following the receipt of final A Level results, we continue to offer support to students in finalising the places they have chosen.

For students who decide that university is not for them, we offer the same level of support and guidance. Careers interviews are arranged and a separate programme of guidance is set up to support the application process. Where possible, we will help to organise work experience placements and do all that we can to help students place themselves in their chosen career.

In addition to excellent academic teaching at A Level, Greenshaw Sixth Form offers an exceptional enrichment curriculum. Students are actively supported and encouraged to develop a wide range of skills such as leadership, independence, initiative, critical thinking and teamwork, preparing them for their next steps in the world of further education or employment.

Whether choosing to take part in charities and fundraising, learning how to programme using Python, mentoring younger students as part of the sports leader programme, or gaining an insight into the world of healthcare professionals with external providers as part of the Healthcare Society, enrichment at Greenshaw provides the opportunity. Our enrichment programme is enhanced by Wednesday afternoon sports sessions in which Sixth Form students can participate in a variety of sports, where no prior experience is required. Although basketball, netball and football seem the most popular, often resulting in student versus staff matches during the year, also on offer is table tennis and use of the fitness suite. Opportunities to attend university taster days, summer schools and lectures are made available each week on Frog and in registration and students are encouraged to attend these.

Each year, 100% of our students engage in widening participation opportunities, both off-site and in virtual settings, and all students complete an internal recruitment day, including a mock interview and assessment centre, and participate in work shadowing for one week at the end of Year 12.

COURSES

The majority of our students follow a course comprising of three A Level subjects. The grade requirement for entry into Greenshaw Sixth Form will be a minimum of five full GCSEs at grade 6 or above, to include at least a grade 5 in both Mathematics and English Language. Subjects may also specify that you need a particular grade in a certain subject before you can take their course at A Level e.g. A Level Mathematics requires a grade 7 in GCSE Mathematics. There are end of year exams in Year 12 to understand progress and enable the prediction of success at the end of the two-year period.
